| Alakenh Street | Alyawarr name for 'that way' |
| Alyawarr Street | One of the four language groups in Ali Curung |
| Brown Street | Named after George Brown, a Waramungu/ Warlpiri man who was the first Aboriginal Police Aid in Ali Curung |
| Driver Street | Named after the Driver brothers, Tommy and Charlie, Warlpiri men who played an important role in establishing Ali Curung in its current location |
| Foster Street | Named after Billy Foster, a Warumungu man and former council president |
| Jackson Street | Named after Jack Jackson, a Warlpiri man and former council president |
| Jangala Street | Skin name |
| Jungarrayi Street | Skin name |
| Kalarra Road | Warlpiri name for west |
| Kaytetye Street | One of the four language groups in Ali Curung |
| Kinjurra Road | Street name in long standing use |
| Newcastle Street | Named after Jimmy Newcastle, a Warlmumpa/ Mudburra man, who was a past president of Ali Curung Council |
| Peterson Street | Named after Pete Peterson, an Alyawarr man who made a significant contribution to maintaining harmony in the early days of Ali Curung |
| Plummer Crescent | Named after Teddy Plummer, a Warumungu man, MBE and former council president |
| Warlpiri Street | One of the four language groups in Ali Curung |
| Warumungu Street | One of the four language groups in Ali Curung |
| Bert Franks Park | Named after Bert Franks, one of the early Baptist ministers who worked in Ali Curung, who established the park |
| Lovegrove Park | after Creed Lovegrove, who planted the grass and established the park |
