## NAMING OF PLACES

- I, Gerald Francis McCarthy, Minister for Lands and Planning, under section 11(1)(a) of the *Place Names Act*, approve the recommendations contained in a report by the Place Names Committee for the Northern Territory that:
- (a) the roads in Morris Soak shown hatched on the map in Schedule 1 be given the names specified on the map; and
- (b) the park in Morris Soak shown bounded by a dashed line on the map in Schedule 1 be given the name specified on the map; and
- (c) the roads in Charles Creek and Kunoth shown hatched on the map in Schedule 2 be given the names specified on the map.





## Schedule 1 – Morris Soak



Place name	Origin of name
Lechleitner Street	Named after Dick Lechleitner, activist, artist and elder.
Miller Cout	Named after Fanny Miller, local indigenous female activist.
Glenmon Court	Named after the daughters of Fanny Miller, Glenda and Mona, who fought for lease arrangements alongside their mother and others.
Walter Forrester Park	Named after Walter Forrester, a member of one of the original family groups to settle at Morris Soak. He established a small area as a park for children to play safely and later developed a small orchard there.

**Schedule 2 – Charles Creek** 



Place name	Origin of name
Little Flower Court	Named after the Little Flower Mission.
Atyunpe Street	Central Arrente word for Perentie (a large lizard).
Paddy Court	Named after Paddy (Patrick) Tucker, first camper to establish a camp site under an ironwood tree at Kunoth.
