
NORTHERN TERRITORY OF AUSTRALIA *Place Names Act* NAMING OF PLACE

I, Peter Glen Chandler, Minister for Lands, Planning and the Environment, under section 11(1)(a) of the *Place Names Act*, approve the recommendation contained in a report of the Place Names Committee for the Northern Territory that the roads shown *hatched* on the map in the Schedule be named Irrampenye Street, Werlatye Court and Maconochie Road.

Note:

Irrampenye Street	named after one of the Traditional Owners of Alice Springs (male), born in the region of the Old Telegraph Station in the mid 1800's (pronounced irrr-ram-pen-ya).
Werlatye Court	named after one of the Traditional Owners of Alice Springs (female), born in the region of the Old Telegraph Station in the mid 1800's (pronounced wool-at-ya).
Maconochie Road	named after John Maconochie who, at the time of his death, had been the longest serving Botanist in the NT, employed continuously in Alice Springs from 1967 to 1984.
