Hodge Street	Named after Major Rex Hodge who served at Headquarters of 23 Australian Infantry Brigade and at 17 ½ Mile in Darwin in March 1942
Angel Road	Named after Staff Sergeant Norman Angel who served in the Headquarters of the 23 Australian Infantry Brigade and at 17 ½ Mile in Darwin during March 1942
Tall Street	Named after Captain Benjamin Tall who served with the 2/9 Australian General Hospital and at 17 ½ Mile in Darwin in March 1942
Henry Road	Named after Major John Henry who served in the 7 Infantry Battalion at 17 ½ Mile in Darwin in March 1942
Redwood Street	Named after Captain John Redwood who served at Headquarters at 23 Australian Infantry Brigade and at 17 ½ Mile in Darwin in March 1942
Teasdale Street	Named after Captain Kenneth Teasdale who served with the 8 Signals Corps and at 17 ½ Mile in Darwin
Freeman Street	Named after Captain Lindsay Freeman who served at 17 ½ Mile in Darwin in March 1942
Marshall Street	Named after Lieutenant Lindsay Marshall who served at HQ, AMF and at 17 ½ Mile in Darwin in March 1942
Lind Road	Named after Brigadier Edmund Lind who was Commanding Officer of the 23rd Infantry Brigade and . He became a Commander of the Order of the British Empire. He served at 17 ½ Mile in Darwin in March 1942
George Street	Named after Lieutenant Ewan George who served at 17 ½ Mile in Darwin in March 1942
Camm Street	Named after Warrant Officer Leo Camm who served at the Headquarters of 23 Australian Infantry Brigade at 17 ½ Mile in Darwin in March 1942
Polglase Circuit	Named after Major Raymond Polglase who served at 20 Company, Royal Australian Engineers at 17 ½ Mile in Darwin in 1942 and in 2/4 Pioneer Battalion
Gayler Court	Named after Lieutenant Charles Gayler who served at 17 ½ Mile in Darwin in March 1942
Davies Court	Named after Lieutenant Colonel Thompson Davies who served in 10/48 Infantry Battalion at 17 ½ Mile in Darwin in March 1942
Prosser Street	Named after Captain Noel Prosser who served at 17 ½ Mile in Darwin in 1942 and in 2/4 Pioneer Battalion
Currie Crescent	Named after Warrant Officer Thomas Currie who served in the 23 Australian Infantry Brigade at 17 ½ Mile in Darwin in March 1942
