I, Terence Kennedy Mills, Minister for Lands, Planning and the Environment, under section 11(1) (a) of the *Place Names Act*, approve the recommendation contained in a report of the Place Names Committee for the Northern Territory that the roads shown hatched on Compiled Plan 5428 be named Chipmunk Court, Falco Court, Fiat Court, Stearman Court, Texan Court, Trojan Court, Hawker Street, Pitts Street, Warbird Street and Zuccoli Parade.

Note: named after the de Havilland Canada DHC-1 Chipmunk, a tandem, two seat, Chipmunk Court single-engined primary trainer aircraft; Falco Court named after an Italian designed lightweight 2-seater aerobatic aircraft the Sequoia F.8L Falco; Fiat Court named after the Fiat G.55 Centauro, a single-engine, single-seat World War II fighter aircraft; Stearman Court named after the Stearman (Boeing) Model 75, a biplane used as a military trainer aircraft: Texan Court named after the North American Aviation T-6 Texan, a single-engine advance trainer aircraft: Trojan Court named after the T-28 Trojan, a piston-engine military trainer aircraft; Hawker Street named after the Hawker Sea Fury, a British fighter aircraft developed for the Royal Navy by Hawker during World War II; Pitts Street named after the Pitts Special. A series of light aerobatic biplanes designed by Cutis Pitts; Warbird Street the name given to military aircrafts that are no longer in use by the military but can be used for racing if restored; and Zuccoli Parade named after Guido Zuccoli who was born in Italy and migrated to Australia as a 20 year old. He worked as a Civil Engineer for Transfield Pty Ltd in Cairns before starting Steelcon Pty Ltd in 1967. Guido died in a plane crash at Tindal Airport on 6 March 1997, when his newly restored Harvard suffered an engine failure.
