
## NAMING OF BRIDGE

- I, Gerald Francis McCarthy, Minister for Lands and Planning, under section 11(1) (a) of the *Place Names Act*, approve the recommendation contained in a report of the Place Names Committee for the Northern Territory that:
- (a) the name Bul Bul Bridge be given to the bridge located over the Daly River in the locality of Tipperary; and
- (b) the name Father Leary Bridge be given to the bridge located on Daly River Road over the Tommys Creek in the locality of Nauiyu.

## Notes:

- 1. Bul Bul Bridge is named after Bul Bul who was a Black-tracker and who gained Australia-wide fame for the phenomenal feats of tracking and bravery he displayed during the hunt for Nemarluk.
- 2. Bul Bul Bridge is located at or about the intersection of parallel of South Latitude 13°45'46" and meridian of East Longitude 130°42'20" (GDA94).
- 3. Father Leary Bridge is named after Father John Leary who was appointed Vicar for the Aboriginal People in 1990. In 2000, Father Leary was appointed a Member of the Order of Australia (OAM) "for services to the spiritual, educational and health needs of the Aboriginal people of the Northern Territory as priest and missionary of the Catholic Church".
- 4. Father Leary Bridge is located at or about the intersection of parallel of South Latitude 13°44'46" and meridian of East Longitude 130°43'10" (GDA94).
