REVOCATION OF PLACE NAME AND NAMING OF PLACES


I, Peter Glen Chandler, Minister for Lands, Planning and the Environment:

- (a) under section 11(1) (a) of the *Place Names Act*, and with reference to section 43 of the *Interpretation Act*, revoke the instrument titled "Naming of public place" dated 27 June 2000 and published in *Gazette* G27 of 12 July 2000; and
- (b) under section 11(1) (a) of the *Place Names Act*, approve the recommendation contained in a report by the Place Names Committee for the Northern Territory that the places shown on the diagram in the Schedule be given the names Azure Court and Tawny Court, as indicated.

Note:

Azure Court is named after the Azure Kingfisher, a bird found around water in the Top End of the Northern Territory.

Tawny Court is named after the Tawny Frogmouth, a nocturnal bird found throughout Australia, including the Northern Territory.
